Poudre Protocols for Safety

Coming to School:

Students may only come to school on their designated days. Students in "A" group come to PHS on Mondays and Wednesdays; students in "B" group come on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

• All students will be required to wear their ID's on their lanyards. This allows us to quickly identify PHS students and their assigned group.

Entering the Building:

To limit the number of students entering through one entrance, we have assigned entrances for students based on grade-level.

- 9th grade students enter the Commons doors
- 10th grade students enter the West Gym doors
- 11th and 12th grade students enter the Main doors

Carrying School Supplies:

Lockers will not be used this year. Unfortunately, lockers are not 6-feet apart, and oftentimes they become areas to congregate.

• Please use a backpack to carry your school supplies. If you need a backpack, we have some available in the counseling office.

Going to Classrooms:

To limit the two-way traffic in narrow hallways, we have labeled the hallways as one-way or two-way hallways. Please adhere to the directions of each hallway. In some cases, it may require you to take a longer route to the restroom or to another area, but it will limit face-to-face contact with others.

Passing Periods and Lunch:

We also want to limit the number of students in the hallway at one time. Therefore, we have created staggered release times which will be initiated through a "first bell" and a "second bell." This will create a 2-minute staggered release. Specific classes will release students at the first bell and other classes will release students at the second bell.

We also have a staggered release at lunch.

- Seniors and juniors will release at the first bell so that those leaving campus may do so immediately.
- Sophomores and Freshmen will be dismissed for lunch on the second bell.

Poudre Protocols for Safety, continued...

Purchasing Breakfast and/or Lunch at School:

Breakfast:

Sack breakfasts will be handed out by Child Nutrition staff to students who wish to participate in school breakfasts. The cafeteria will serve the meals off the normal serving lines during each school's normal schedules breakfast time (typically 30 minutes before classes start). The entire meal will be in sacks and students who want to participate in breakfast simply come though the line with their masks on, kitchen staff with gloves and masks will hand them their meals from behind the serving lines (sneeze guards or face shield depending on kitchen), and student tells the Child Nutrition employee their ID number or name for CDE meal accounting.

Lunch:

Sack lunch meals will be served by Child Nutrition staff in the cafeteria to students who wish to participate in school meal service. Meals will be served in the cafeteria off the normal serving lines. We also have an additional location to distribute sack lunches so that we can disperse students. Meals will be accounted for by Child Nutrition staff similar to the normal serving processes. The only differences are students pick up all their meal components in one sack that has been prepared by kitchen staff and students will tell kitchen staff their ID number (or name) versus typing their ID number into the keypad.

Masks may be removed while eating meals, but must be put back on immediately after finishing meals.

Student Seating During Lunch:

Social-distancing is important to limit the spread of COVID and we must be able to track where students are in relation to other students and staff. Therefore, we have created numbered spots that are 12-feet apart and clearly marked to ensure physical distancing. Students must be seated at one of these spots so that we can insure social distancing. Students must stay seated for the duration of lunch or they may go outside; students cannot roam halls.

Students are also able to eat lunch outside. We have many grassy knolls and outdoor seating areas. When outside, students can remove their masks, but they are still required to maintain appropriate distance from others.

While in classrooms:

Classrooms will be disinfected between all classes. The disinfectant used has a 10-minute kill claim for COVID-19 and a 10-minute dry time. Students will be required to wear masks whenever they are in the building. Masks will be required in all classrooms for students and teachers. Teachers will be conscientious about providing mask breaks outside. Teachers have arranged their classroom space to create distance among students and they have systems in place to limit movement during class. Cleaning protocols will differ depending on the types of equipment or supplies used in a class.

Off periods:

If a student has an off-period, they have a few options for where they can go during the period:

- 1. They may leave campus
- 2. They may go to the Media Center
- 3. They may go to the Commons


Both the Commons and Media Center have been arranged to provide 6-feet distance between seats. QR codes are adhered to tables so that students can check-in to their seats for contact-tracing purposes.

End of Day Dismissal:

Students will be dismissed from class in a staggered release. Once dismissed, students must leave campus immediately, unless they have a scheduled appointment with a staff member or are participating in athletics. No students can loiter in the building.

How PSD will respond to COVID-19 cases


PSD will take different – but still health department-approved – approaches to contact tracing by grade level in the second semester. This work is done in partnership with LCDHE.


Enhanced contact tracing: Rather than investigating and identifying close contacts, all students in a classroom will shift to remote education for 10 days to prevent the possible spread of the virus. Staff members (homeroom teachers, paraprofessionals, etc.) identified as close contacts will also shift remote. All may return to school/work once cleared to do so. This is a change between first and second semester.

Targeted contact tracing: PSD COVID-19 Response Teams investigate and identify possible close contacts (zero to X number); LCDHE issues orders to quarantine. Contact tracing happens in a classroom but also extends into lunchrooms, buses, athletics and other school-specific spaces.

Who is a close contact?

- · Less than 6 feet for more than 15 minutes
- Maintaining 6 feet or more of distance is not always possible within some PSD schools due to space constraints that are difficult to reconcile with educating more students more of the time.
- Recognizing this challenge, the <u>Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE)</u> and <u>LCDHE</u> allow schools to seat students between 3-6 feet apart.





Every COVID-19 case investigation is unique and may require slightly varied responses. However, these graphics indicate generally which students may be identified as possible close contacts, depending on the size and set-up of the classroom. If a middle school student with five classes tests positive for COVID-19, there will likely be close contacts identified in each of their classes.

Temporary school closures:

This is new for the second semester. From Jan. 19 and until otherwise specified, PSD leadership and Health Services staff will discuss with principals whether a temporary school closure is necessary when a school's case percentage goes above 1%, as displayed on PSD's data dashboard. Families should be prepared that their student's school may be affected by this new change and that they may receive little notice before a temporary closure occurs.


Data transparency: Each PSD department and school has a COVID-19 Response Team. PSD's COVID-19 data dashboards display data entered by COVID-19 response teams and are kept as current as possible on the <u>PSD COVID-19 Data and School Information web page</u>.

Preschool/Elementary - will follow enhanced contact tracing

- Why the change from targeted to enhanced contact tracing between first and second semester? We do not believe PSD preschool/elementary COVID-19 Response Teams would be able to balance the significant workload of targeted contact tracing and keep our youngest learners in school all day, every day.
- Although we recognize the remote shift is disruptive, this approach reduces case response work and allows staff to have the time to consistently deliver full-time in-person education.
- LCDHE will issue quarantine orders to students

Middle and high school - will follow targeted contact tracing

- Targeted contact tracing in secondary schools second semester will look like it did first semester.
- School COVID-19 Response Teams will identify recommended possible close contacts of the infected individual and shift those people to remote teaching/ learning for an Initial Assessment Period with LCDHE.
- At the end of the assessment period,
 LCDHE confirms close contacts and issues
- quarantine orders (quarantine date may vary by person depending on exposure date to the positive individual).
- We believe targeted tracing is less disruptive and more sustainable at the secondary level. Enhanced tracing is thought to be more difficult for secondary teachers to manage, who engage with multiple classes in a day, compared with an elementary homeroom teacher who interacts with one.



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The Optional **SAT** with Essay in Colorado

11th-grade public school students in Colorado can add the SAT° with Essay to their SAT School Day registration for free. The Colorado Department of Education will cover all fees so you can take the SAT with Essay during the school day on April 13, 2021.

About the SAT with Essay

- The SAT with Essay will take approximately one hour longer than the SAT.
- It's your choice. You decide whether or not to take the SAT with Essay.
- The SAT Essay is scored separately from the SAT and does not impact your Evidence-Based Reading and Writing score.

Why Take the SAT with Essay?

The SAT Essay lets you practice your skills and gives you a chance to show colleges that you're ready for college-level writing assignments. Some colleges may specifically require it as a part of the admission process (we recommend that you confirm admission policies with your school of choice).

It's About the Real World

The SAT with Essay is a lot like a typical college writing assignment that asks you to analyze a text. It shows colleges you're ready to get to campus and write.

You'll have 50 minutes to:

- Read a passage
- Explain how the author builds an argument to persuade an audience
- Support your explanation with evidence from the passage

Register for the SAT with Essay

You can take the SAT with Essay at no additional cost. You must register between **January 18 and February 16, 2021**.

REGISTER ONLINE:

Register online before 10:00 p.m. Mountain Time (MT) on February 16, 2021, using your College Board account.

- Go to sat.org and sign into your College Board account. If you've forgotten your username or password, click the link to recover them. Please do NOT create a new account. Once you're signed in, click on your username in the upper right-hand corner. Then select "My SAT."
- If you do not have a College Board

 the required fields (name, sex, DOB, email
 address, expected HS graduation date)
 to create your account. Click "Continue"
 on the SAT Registration page. Review
 and complete the "Personal Info," "Your
 High School," and "Your Mailing Address"
 screens. You may be asked to provide
 "Your Previous Registration Number."
 Choose "Yes" and enter the registration
 number provided by your counselor.
- 3 Select "Change Registration" from the My SAT homepage. If you don't see your registration listed here, call customer service at 866-917-9030 for assistance.
- 4 Select "Add the essay to my registration from the Change Your Registration page."
- Once the "Add the essay to my registration" link is selected, a confirmation message will appear. Click "OK" to continue. Congratulations! You're registered for the SAT with Essay.

If you decide later on that you would like to remove the essay from your registration, sign into your College Board account and select "Remove the essay from my registration" before February 16, 2021. Test day changes to add or remove the essay will not be allowed.

El SAT con ensayo opcional en Colorado

Los estudiantes de 11º grado de las escuelas públicas de Colorado pueden agregar de manera gratuita el SAT® con ensayo (SAT with Essay) a su inscripción para el SAT en la Escuela. El Departamento de Educación de Colorado cubrirá todas las tarifas para que puedas presentar el SAT con ensayo durante el día escolar el 13 de abril de 2021.

Sobre el SAT con ensayo

- El SAT con ensayo durará aproximadamente una hora más que el SAT.
- Es decisión tuya. Tú decides si quieres presentar o no el SAT con ensayo.
- El SAT con ensayo se puntúa de manera separada al SAT y no tiene impacto en tu puntuación de Lectura y Redacción basadas en evidencia.

¿Por qué presentar el SAT con ensayo?

El SAT con ensayo te permite practicar tus destrezas y te da la oportunidad de mostrar a las universidades que estás listo para las tareas de redacción a nivel universitario. - Explicar cómo el autor desarrolla un argumento para persuadir a su público.
- Apoyar tu explicación con evidencia del pasaje.

Puedes presentar el SAT con ensayo sin costo adicional. Debes inscribirte entre el 18 de enero y el 16 de febrero de 2021.

Inscribete en línea antes de las 10:00 p.m., hora de la montaña (MT), del 18 de febrero de 2020 usando tu cuenta de College Board.



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Sports Season C

ALL ITEMS LISTED BELOW ARE DUE BEFORE PRACTICE ON 3/8/21

The Athletic Department has some updates and procedural changes to be aware of as we get ready for season C. In an effort to reduce the number of people in and out of the front office at this time we are requesting that all parents/athletes register, pay the athletic fee, and turn in paperwork via email and online.

Starting Monday, February 22nd you will be able to start turning in your paperwork, registering online, and paying the athletic fee for season C.

If you played a sport earlier this year you will only need to email me and ask to transfer your Physical from your previous sport to your Season C Sport and send me proof of athletic fee payment online.

If this is your first sport this school year you must complete the following:

- 1. Complete your athletes online registration at: https://poudreathletics.sportngin.com/register/form/084281362
- 2. Pay the athletic fee online at: https://psdschools.schoolpay.com/
- 3. Scan, or take a picture of your athlete's current physical form signed by the doctor and email to: nmichele@psdschools.org
- 4. Please complete this order, if one item is not taken care of, your athlete will not be on the Permission to Practice Roster. (This roster will be done in place of kids getting an orange practice card for this season, your athlete will not get an orange practice card this year)
- 5. Each coach will get a roster on the first day of their sport stating who is eligible and has completed all necessary steps. If your athlete is not on the coaches roster, they will not be permitted to practice until all steps are taken care of.
- 6. I will respond with an email confirming I have received all of your athlete's paperwork and that they are good to start practice on their first day of official practice.
- 7. If you are on the Federal Free or Reduced Lunch Program you must still process a payment in school pay. Log into School Pay, select your sport, go to check out and it will show up as \$0.00 due. If it does not show up like this then you are missing a step for the waived fees or you are not on waived fees.




