### From PHS Administration

Poudre families,

Despite the challenges we continue to face with COVID, the persistence our students have shown has resulted in some awesome outcomes! Below are the “On-Track” rates of each grade level:

9th grade= 88.1% on track  
10th grade= 87.6% on track  
11th grade= 84.3% on track  
12th grade=89.6% on track

The on-track metric calculates the number of credits earned to ensure that a student can graduate in 4 years. In addition to measuring how many credits students are earning, we monitor how well they’re doing in their classes by identifying the percentage of students with all “B’s or better”. Last semester 46% of students earned all B’s or better! Congratulations to our Impalas for successfully navigating a challenging first semester. We’re incredibly proud of you! I am who I am because of who we are. We are Poudre!

## Next School Year Registration

### “How registration is going to work this year” information

On January 26<sup>th</sup>, first day of next school year registration, the following happened:

Period 1 - Registration Presentation

- Students received paperwork with the classes that will be offered in the 2022-2023 school year. Graduation requirements were reviewed.

After that they attended Class Rush + where they will be able to talk with teachers to determine what electives they are interested in. Lastly, they went to their second period class and watched a video on how to enroll in classes through the Xello program on their computer.

- Students need to keep the registration paperwork they receive in their 1st period class. It has a label on it with the date, time, and location the student will be meeting with their counselor 1-on-1 to review their class registration requests.
  - Students transferring to Wellington MHS next year also completed this process. Wellington administration and counselors were at Poudre HS during Class Rush +.

### Reminders for class registration:

- Students may register for classes listed for lower grade levels. If they are interested in an upper-level class, they will need their counselor's approval.
- Remind students to consider prerequisites and selecting both semester 1 & 2 or A & B where appropriate.
- Class descriptions can be found in Xello
- **Sophomores** and **Juniors** must take Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies
- All incoming **Seniors** must check their graduation profile to ensure they take classes in subject areas needed for graduation (240 credits).
- Finance, Economics and some Humanities should be taken in **Junior/ Senior** year.
- Incoming **Juniors and Seniors** must take at least 60 credits no matter how many they need for graduation. Students that have classes at Front Range Community College, Aims CC, Work Based Learning, Credit Recovery, early graduation, etc., can review credit options with their counselor.
- Incoming **Sophomores** must take at least 70 credits.
- Class registration will not be finalized until they click on **Submit in Xello**. After that they cannot make changes. **Submit** must be clicked before the scheduled appointment with their counselor.

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## Next School Year Registration, continued...

### Meeting with Counselor:

**Freshman**, on February 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> will meet one-on-one with their counselor during their assigned registration time (find on label on front page of gold or blue paper) to review what classes they have submitted in Xello. Students started working on this last semester.

- Required classes for **Sophomore** year: English 10 (S1&S2), World Geography/History 2 (S1&S2), a Science class (S1&S2) and a Math class.
- If you have questions about which class/level to take next, talk to your teachers from this year.
- Sophomores must take at least 70 credits worth of classes during the year.

**Sophomores**, on February 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> will meet with their counselor one-on-one during their assigned registration time (find on label on front page of gold or blue paper) to review what they have submitted into their Xello account.

- Required classes for **Junior** year: can all be found on your paper, just work your way
- down the list and check things in all boxes needed.
- If you have questions about levels and classes talk to your teachers from this year.
- You must take at least 60 credits worth of classes.

**Juniors**, on February 9<sup>th</sup> - 11<sup>th</sup> will meet with their counselor one-on-one during their assigned registration time (find on label on front page of gold or blue paper) to review the classes they submitted in Xello.

- Make sure you are checking your graduation profiles to ensure you take classes in all subject areas that you need for graduation.

## Spring testing is when our Impalas... SOCK IT TO THE TEST!

- April 13: Juniors take the SAT exam at PHS.
- April 13: Sophomores take the PSAT 10 exam at PHS.
- April 14: Juniors take the CMAS exam at PHS.
- April 14: Freshmen take the PSAT 9 exam at PHS.



These exams are free for students and fulfill state and district graduation requirements.





## The Optional **SAT** with Essay in Colorado

11th-grade public school students in Colorado can add the SAT<sup>®</sup> with Essay to their SAT School Day registration for free. The Colorado Department of Education will cover all fees so you can take the SAT with Essay **during the school day** on April 13, 2022.

### About the SAT with Essay

- The SAT with Essay will take approximately one hour longer than the SAT.
- It's your choice. You decide whether or not to take the SAT with Essay.
- The SAT Essay is scored separately from the SAT and does not impact your Evidence-Based Reading and Writing score.

### Why Take the SAT with Essay?

The SAT Essay lets you practice your skills and gives you a chance to show colleges that you're ready for college-level writing assignments.

### It's About the Real World

The SAT with Essay is a lot like a typical college writing assignment that asks you to analyze a text. It shows colleges you're ready to get to campus and write.

You'll have 50 minutes to:

- Read a passage
- Explain how the author builds an argument to persuade an audience
- Support your explanation with evidence from the passage

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## Register for the SAT with Essay

You can take the SAT with Essay at no additional cost. You must register between **January 17 and February 15, 2022.**

### REGISTER ONLINE:

Register online before 10:00 p.m. Mountain Time (MT) on February 15, 2022, using your College Board account.

- 1 Go to [sat.org](https://sat.org) and sign into your College Board account. If you've forgotten your username or password, click the link to recover them. Please do NOT create a new account. Once you're signed in, click on your username in the upper right-hand corner. Then select "My SAT."
- 2 If you do not have a College Board account, go to [sat.org](https://sat.org) and click "Register Now." Choose "Sign Up" and complete the required fields (name, sex, DOB, email address, expected HS graduation date) to create your account. Click "Continue" on the SAT Registration page. Review and complete the "Personal Info," "Your High School," and "Your Mailing Address" screens. You may be asked to provide "Your Previous Registration Number." Choose "Yes" and enter the registration number provided by your counselor.
- 3 Select "Change Registration" from the My SAT homepage. If you don't see your registration listed here, call customer service at 866-917-9030 for assistance.
- 4 Select "Yes" from the Change Essay Preference page.
- 5 Click "Confirm" to continue. Congratulations! You're registered for the SAT with Essay.

If you decide later on that you would like to remove the essay from your registration, sign into your College Board account and select "Change Registration" to remove the Essay before **February 15, 2022**. Test day changes to add or remove the essay will not be allowed.

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# El SAT con ensayo opcional en Colorado

Los estudiantes de 11º grado de las escuelas públicas de Colorado pueden agregar de manera gratuita el SAT® con ensayo (SAT with Essay) a su inscripción para el SAT en la Escuela. El Departamento de Educación de Colorado cubrirá todas las tarifas para que puedas presentar el SAT con ensayo durante el día escolar el 13 de abril de 2022.

## Sobre el SAT con ensayo

- El SAT con ensayo durará aproximadamente una hora más que el SAT.
- Es decisión tuya. Tú decides si quieres presentar o no el SAT con ensayo.
- El SAT con ensayo se puntúa de manera separada al SAT y no tiene impacto en tu puntuación de Lectura y Redacción basadas en evidencia.

## ¿Por qué presentar el SAT con ensayo?

## Cómo inscribirse al SAT con Ensayo

Puedes presentar el SAT con ensayo sin costo adicional. Debes inscribirte entre el **17 de enero y el 15 de febrero de 2022**.

### INSCRIPCIÓN EN LÍNEA:

Inscríbete en línea antes de las 10:00 p.m., hora de la montaña (MT), del 18 de febrero de 2020 usando tu cuenta de College Board.

1. Ve a **sat.org** y entra a tu cuenta del College Board. Si has olvidado tu nombre de usuario o la contraseña, haz clic en el link para recuperarlos. **NO** crees una cuenta nueva. Una vez en tu cuenta, haz clic en tu nombre de usuario que aparece en la esquina superior derecha. Luego selecciona "Mi SAT" (My SAT).
2. Si no tienes una cuenta de College Board, ve a **sat.org** y haz clic en "Registrarse ahora" (Register Now). Escoge "Entrar" (Sign in) y completa los campos requeridos (nombre, sexo, fecha de nacimiento, dirección de correo electrónico, fecha esperada de graduación de la escuela preparatoria) para crear tu cuenta. Haz clic en "Continuar" (Continue) en la página de inscripción del SAT. Repasa y completa las pantallas de "Información personal" (Personal Info), "Tu Preparatoria" (Your High School) y "Tu dirección de envío" (Your Mailing Address). Es posible que te pidan "Tu número previo de inscripción" (Your Previous Registration Number). Escoge "Sí" (Yes) e introduce el número que te dio tu consejero.
3. Selecciona "**Cambiar registro**" (Change Registration) de la página de inicio de Mi SAT (My SAT). Si no ves tu registro en esa lista, llama a Servicio a clientes al 866-917-9030 para que te ayuden.
4. Selecciona "**Añadir ensayo a mi inscripción desde la página Cambia tu inscripción**".
5. Una vez que hayas seleccionado el link "Añadir ensayo a mi inscripción" (Add the Essay to my Registration), aparecerá un mensaje de confirmación. Haz clic en "**OK**" para continuar. ¡Felicidades! Ya estás registrado para el SAT con ensayo.  
Si decides más tarde que te gustaría quitar el ensayo de tu inscripción, entra a tu cuenta de College Board y selecciona "**Eliminar ensayo de mi registro**" (Remove the essay from my registration) antes del **15 de febrero de 2022**. No se permiten cambios el día del examen para agregar o eliminar el ensayo.

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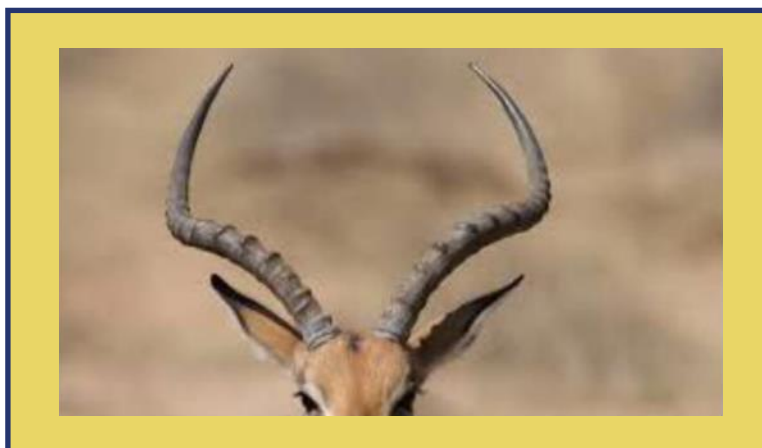

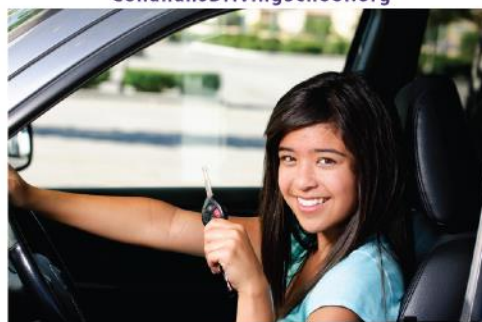

### PHS Clay Target League Club

- The Poudre High School Clay Target League Club is part of the Colorado State High School Clay Target League [www.coclaysport.com](http://www.coclaysport.com) which is the local chapter of the USA Clay Target League [www.usaclaytarget.com](http://www.usaclaytarget.com). Poudre's team is coached by Reid Kalsow and sponsored by PHS staff members, Shawn Niedenzu and Wes Fuller. The League offers four different clay target shooting sport "virtual" leagues. "Virtual" means that teams shoot at their local shooting range(s), submit the scores online, and then those scores are compared against all other teams in their respective conference. There is no need to travel to other shooting ranges to compete in head-to-head competitions. Conferences are determined by the type of clay target sport and then by similar team sizes. The clay target shooting sport league offerings include trap shooting, skeet shooting, sporting clays and 5-stand. Teams can compete in one or more leagues as determined by their preferred clay target sport(s).

Each student may submit up to five pieces in EACH of the following categories: Poetry, Prose, 2-D Art, 3-D Art, Photography, and Original Songs.

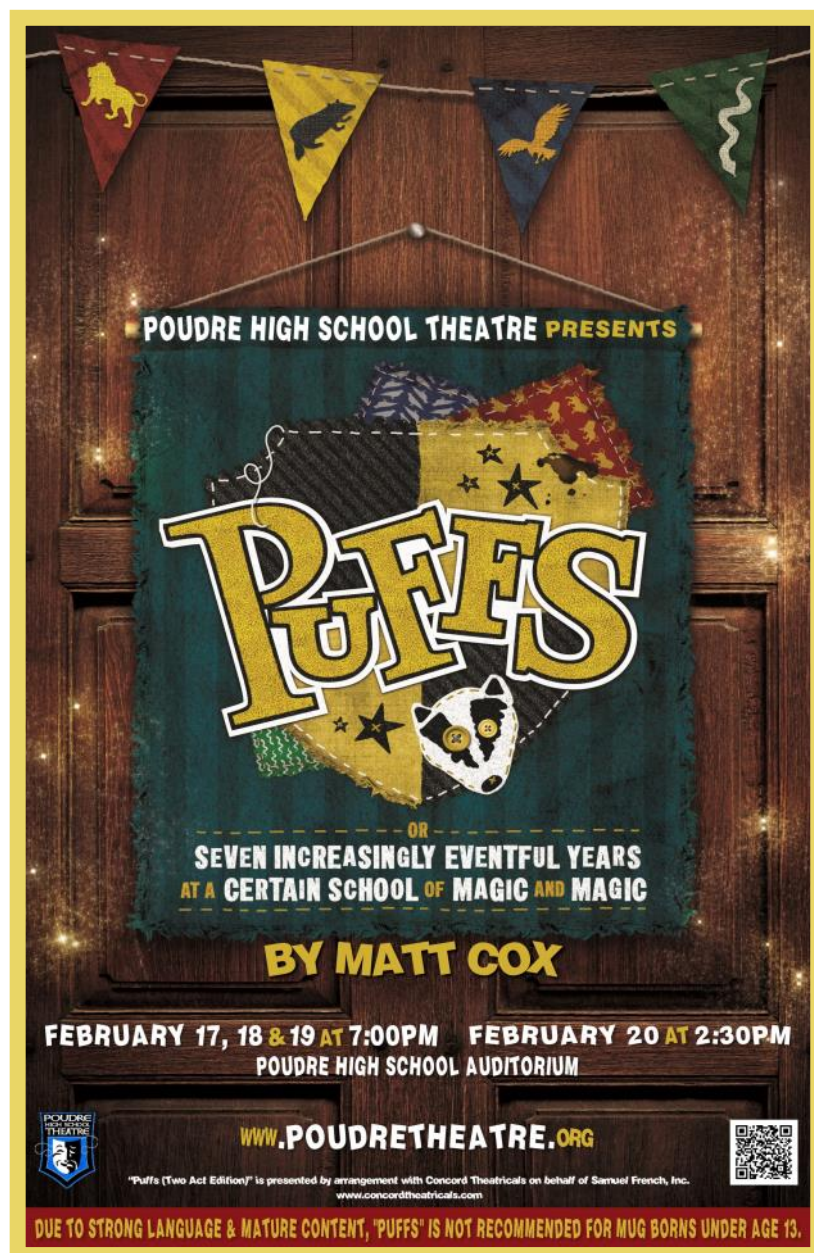
