


Spring Testing information:

- 9th graders take the PSAT 9 Thurs, April 14
- 10th graders take the PSAT 10 Wed, April 13
- 11th graders take the SAT Wed, April 13
- 11th graders take the CMAS Science Exam Thurs, April 14
 - ° Classes at PHS will be asynchronous on April 13 and 14.
 - O Buses will be running at the same scheduled time.
 - Students who ride the bus will be provided a designated location at PHS after they complete their exam.

Each year we have families request to opt out of an exam. I have attached this year's state testing opt out form for your convenience.

Please remind students and that they must demonstrate readiness for college and career based on at least one measure in Reading, Writing and Communicating, and one measure in Mathematics to graduate. For some students, this might mean that they need to take the SAT exam to graduate. Please tell students to check in with their counselor before opting out of an exam. I have attached the 2021 graduation guidelines from CDE.

The school is penalized for students who both don't take the exam and do not submit an opt out form.

GRADUATION GUIDELINES | FACT SHEET Menu of College and

Career-Ready Demonstrations



High school graduation requirements are set by local school boards. They must align with the Colorado Graduation Guidelines, which are designed to help all students and families in Colorado plan for success after high school.

Local school boards and districts select from this menu to create a list of options that their students must use to show what they know of can do in order to graduate from high school. Schools districts may offer some or all of the state menu options, may raise a cut score on an included assessment and may add graduation requirements in other content areas.

Districts have the authority to provide accommodations to students in meeting the college and career demonstrations necessary to earn a standard high school diploma for: English learners, gifted students and students with disabilities.

Graduation Guidelines begin with the implementation of Individual Career and Academic Plans (ICAP); 21st Century Essential Skills; and Colorado Academic Standards for all content areas, including: one course in Civics, and by July 2023, one course that incorporates Genocide and Holocaust studies.

Students must demonstrate readiness for college and career based on at least one measure in Reading, Writing and Communicating, and one measure in Mathematics 1.

ACT WorkKeys - National Career Readiness Certificate

Bronze or higher

ACT WorkKeys is an assessment that tests students' job skills in applied reading, writing, mathematics and 21st century skills. Scores are based on job profiles that help employers select, hire, train, develop and retain a high-performance workforce. Students must score at the bronze level (a score of at least 3) in all three assessments- Applied Mathematics, Graphic Literacy and Workplace Documents - and they will earn the ACT's National Career Readiness Certificate.

In order to match the language in statute for Colorado Academic Standards, and to better reflect the skills necessary for success in life after high school, "English" and "Math" have been more clearly defined as, "Reading, Writing, and Communicating" and "Mathematics."

Students who take the ASVAB are not required to enlist in the military.

An eligible concurrent enrollment course is 1 the prerequisite directly prior to a credit-bearing course or 2) a credit-bearing course, and 3) governed by a district-level cooperative agreement or MOU. 2021-22 State Testing Opt-Out Form

The Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) is an assessment system designed to measure student mastery of the Colorado Academic Standards. CMAS includes testing for English Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies in grades 3 - 8. Students participate in PSAT preparatory exams in grades 9 - 10 and the SAT college entrance exam and CMAS Science in grade 11. Students who qualify for alternate assessments are those with significant cognitive disabilities for whom general state assessments are not appropriate. Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) is the alternate assessment for English Language Arts and Math for students in grades 3 - 11. The Colorado Alternate assessment (CoAlt) is the alternate assessment for Science and Social Studies.

In December of 2009, Colorado adopted revised academic content standards progressing from early school readiness to postsecondary competencies reflective of both workforce readiness and 21st century skills. Student progress toward these outcomes is measured through results from CMAS, PSAT, and SAT, which provide information to teachers as they incorporate the content standards in their daily instruction. These results are also used for school and district accountability.

By opting out, I recognize that I will not receive results of my child's achievement and growth as measured by these assessments. I also understand that educators use these results for instructional planning, class placement, and academic screening, and that this information will not be available to my child's educators.

Las Medidas del Éxito Académico de Colorado (CMAS, por sus siglas en inglés) es un sistema de evaluación, diseñado para medir el dominio estudiantil de los Estándares de Contenido Académico de Colorado. CMAS consta de las pruebas de artes del lenguaje inglés, matemáticas, ciencias y estudios sociales para 3.er a 8.º grado. Los estudiantes en los grados 9 y 10 participan en los exámenes preparatorios de ingreso a la universidad (PSAT, por sus siglas en inglés), mientras que los alumnos de 11.º grado toman el examen de ingreso a la universidad (SAT, por sus siglas en inglés) y la prueba de ciencias de CMAS. Los estudiantes con discapacidades cognitivas significativas califican para tomar evaluaciones alternas, debido a que las evaluaciones estatales generales no son apropiadas para ellos. La prueba Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM, por sus siglas en inglés) es la evaluación alterna de las artes del lenguaje inglés y matemáticas, para los estudiantes de 3.er a 11.º grado. La Prueba Alterna de Colorado (CoAlt, por sus siglas en inglés) evalúa ciencias y estudios sociales.

En diciembre de 2009, Colorado aprobó los Estándares Revisados de Contenido Académico, que abarcan desde la preparación en preescolar para la etapa escolar, hasta las competencias para la etapa posterior a "high school" (preparatoria). Dichos estándares reflejan la capacidad para formar parte del mundo laboral, al igual que el tener las habilidades necesarias para el siglo 21. El progreso del estudiante encaminado al logro de estos objetivos se mide a través de los resultados de las pruebas CMAS, PSAT y SAT, los cuales proveen información a los maestros a medida que incorporan los estándares de contenido académico a su instrucción diaria. Estos resultados también se utilizan para dar a conocer el desempeño tanto de la escuela como del Distrito.



في ديسمبر من عام 2009 اعتمدت ولاية كولورادو معايير المحتوى الاكاديمي المنقحة والتطورة من الاستعداد المبكر للمدرسة الى كفاءات ما بعد المرحلة الثانوية والتي تعكس كل من استعدادات القوى العاملة ومعارات القرت 21. يتم قياس تقدم الطلاب نحو هذه النتائج من خلال نتائج CMAS, PSAT, and SAT والتي توفر المعلومات للمعلمين عند دمجهم معايير المحتوى في تعليمهم اليومي. وتستخدم هذه النتائج ايضا لتقييم المدارس والادارة.
