## **Message from the Principal**

Dear Poudre parents/guardians and seniors,

We are so excited to celebrate our seniors at Colorado State University's Moby Arena, 951 W. Plum St. in Fort Collins. The following is a guide to convocation for the Class of 2022.

#### When is graduation?

- Friday, May 20 Colorado State University Moby Arena, 951 W. Plum St.
  - 6:30 p.m. Poudre High School

#### What you need to know about ceremonies at Moby Arena

Number of guests: There is no limit to the number of guests per graduate who may attend.

#### When to arrive:

- We will communicate with graduates about when they should arrive.
- Doors open to guests one hour before each ceremony.

#### Parking:

- Attendants will direct families to free parking in lots to the west and north of Moby.
- Please consider carpooling or other ways to reduce the number of vehicles.

#### Where to enter Moby Arena:

- Graduates enter through the southern, upper doors.
- Guests enter through the northern, upper doors.

#### Magnometers:

- CSU requires that all guests and employees pass through a metal detector.
- Alternative accommodations for screening will be provided for those who need it.
- Guests who refuse screening will be denied entry.
- All personal items, including cameras, must go through the metal detectors.

#### Clear-bag policy, water bottles and food:

- Moby has a clear-bag policy and limits on the size of bags allowed. <u>Read more here</u> about what is and is not permitted. It is best to bring no bag at all, if possible.
- Guests may bring transparent, non-hard water bottles.
- Moby concessions will not be open.

Seating: There is no reserved seating and no tickets required.

#### ADA accessibility:

- CSU does not have wheelchairs; please bring one if needed.
- You may drop members of your party off near the west entrance of Moby before proceeding to parking.
- One individual may sit with a guest in ADA-accessible seating, which is available on a first-come, first-served basis.

#### **Interpretation services**

- PSD interpreters will be available for Spanish-speaking families. Attendants will direct families where they may sit for these services.
- Guests who need hearing-impaired interpretation services may sit in Section N.

**Livestreams:** PSDTV will livestream graduation ceremonies for those unable to attend. Links will be sent out closer to May.

Please let us know if you have any questions. We cannot wait to honor our Class of 2022 in a few short weeks.





## **ACP Transportation Release**







**ACP services:** The Address Confidentiality Program (ACP) is a statewide program that provides survivors of domestic violence, sexual offenses, and/or stalking with two services: a legal substitute address for interacting with all state and local government agencies and a confidential mail forwarding service. Uses for the substitute address include: drivers licensing, school enrollment, human services benefits, police and court reports, voter registration records, bank accounts, special protections on Comcast, and other utility accounts.

#### POUDRE SCHOOL DISTRICT TRANSPORTATION RELEASE:

Poudre School District does understand the importance of your child's safety in the Address Confidentiality Program. In an emergency situation, all students need to be accounted for, and student safety is of utmost importance. In order to accomplish both of these, we will need to have the school and pickup/drop off location listed for your child. This application is confidential information with limited access to only staff needing the data for routing and will not be copied nor will verbal information be released. This form will be filed at the Poudre School District Records Center only and will not be placed in the student's cumulative file housed at the school.

Transportation eligibility for students is based upon the distance between their home and their neighborhood school. Please note, your child may not ride the bus before transportation eligibility and approval has been approved by the Transportation Services Department at Poudre School District. Please note while waiting for telephone notification of approval, it is your responsibility to provide transportation for your child.

#### **Athletic Participation Fee:**

<u>PHS Students</u> \$190.00 per sport no family max <u>Charter/ Home or Private School Students</u> \$285.00 per sport no family max

Payment of athletic fee is required in order to receive a Orange Card. <u>YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIAPTE</u> <u>IF YOUR FEE IS NOT PAID IN FULL BEFORE TRYOUTS</u>! If a student athlete is not offered a spot on a team, the athletic fee will be reimbursed in full. Students who meet federal guidelines for the free or reduced lunch program will have the participation fee waived.

#### Eligibility

Eligibility will be checked at the beginning of each season. Fall eligibility is determined in August based on spring semester grades earned. Athletes identified as failing two or more classes during spring semester will be ineligible for fall sports until the second week in October.

PHS checks athletic eligibility on a weekly basis. Athletes identified as failing two or more classes will be declared ineligible and will lose one week of eligibility beginning on the following Monday through Saturday. 

#### E- Sports 2022- 2023

The eSports team at Poudre High School has just finished its second season in its first year. The team works most similarly to a Track and Field team. While the team as a whole is a community, each small group participates and competes on its own within its own event.

Our team this year competed in two different events, Rocket League and League of Legends. Rocket league is a 3 vs 3 game in which students pilot super-fast cars in a (literally) explosive, high-octane game of soccer. This year we had two teams compete in regionals in the fall and were very close to making it to state for the spring season. League of Legends is a 5 vs 5 game wherein students utilize specialized heroes in an attempt to push back the other team and destroy the enemy base. In the fall semester our team made it and competed in the Western States Regional competition, and in the spring semester we were only off by 2 points from making it into the State tournament once again!

At its core, eSports is about community, leadership, communication, and a drive to improve. The teams strive to push one another to grow and do better with each passing match and practice. Next year our team will continue to grow with the addition of Super Smash Bros, Mario Kart, and Hearthstone, each of which will bring its own new set of challenges to overcome, strategies to design and work around, and hopefully an even larger community to push our school to succeed as we face off against more teams starting next fall. Our team will continue to push forward, and we can't wait to see what's in store for us next year.

Next school year we will be having 2 seasons, Fall and Spring, just like this year. As of right now the following games have the potential for us to participate in

- League of Legends (Teams of 5) CHSAA
- Rocket League (Teams of 3) CHSAA
- Hearthstone (Teams of 3) Western States Region

With Super Smash Bros (CHSAA Teams of 3) and Mario Kart (WSR teams of 4) potentially being available in the Spring depending on interest and a couple of issues can get worked out. Tech fee is currently \$65 but that may go up depending on prices of team participation and resources that we may need. Students will be required to commit to one practice and one game day per week which will be after school from 4:00pm (3:30 for game days) to 6:00pm on currently unknown days.
