Welcome PHS families to the 2025-2026 School Year!


We hope you all had a relaxing and rejuvenating summer. We are thankful to be starting a new school year with all of our students. We recognize that relationships and connections are incredibly important to teenagers' lives, and we will offer numerous opportunities throughout the school year for students to connect to adults, peers, and to their interests. We are excited to announce the opening of our renovated Technical Education space. Poudre School



opening of our renovated Technical Education space. Poudre School District received a 1-million-dollar grant from the Bohemian Foundation and 1-million-dollar grant from Larimer County for improvements to both the space and equipment to make our Tech Ed area state of the art! This school year our Geometry and Construction class in conjunction with Habitat for Humanity will be completing their 13th and 14th homes to be moved into the community for well-deserving families. Our Agriculture teachers received a grant for honeybees which will be joining our chickens to be studied and looked after by students in our agricultural classes. Our theater department will be performing the musical "Hadestown the teen edition" this fall and the winter and spring plays of "Lost Girl" and "Much Ado About Nothing". These are just a few of the many opportunities for students to get involved.

This year, we will be continuing in our third year of the JROTC program. The JROTC program teaches character education, student achievement, health and wellness, leadership and diversity. You may have seen the color guard at many sporting events and graduation ceremonies. The program is jointly conducted through a partnership between the US Department of Defense and PSD. We're also happy to share our campus with the district's Career Tech Center (CTC), formerly known as the Futures Lab. The CTC offers high school & college credit, industry certifications, & work-based learning and apprenticeship opportunities. Pathways are aligned to high-demand industries such as: Aviation, AI and programming, Cybersecurity, Construction Management, Advanced Manufacturing, Early Childhood Education, Behavioral Health, Medical Assistant, and Automotive. Both JROTC and CTC courses are offered in AM and PM blocks. PSD students can take half-day classes at their home high school and half-day at JROTC or the CTC. SCHEDULE REPAIR REQUESTS

Student schedules will be available to view starting in **August 2025** through StudentVue/ParentVue and we wanted to share the process for making schedule repairs.

Please set up an appointment with your counselor as changes may not be able to be completed via email. Counselors are in the building at the beginning of August 2025.

Schedule repairs will only be granted for the following reasons:

- Duplicate classes (ex: Two Chemistry classes)
- Class I did not register for (and was not listed as an alternate class)
- Incorrect level placement
- Completed coursework over the summer
- Not meeting a graduation requirement with my current schedule (SENIORS only)
- Want to drop a class (students must have a minimum of 3 classes each quarter)
- Missing a prerequisite for a course that is currently on my schedule
- 9th and 10th grade students must take a minimum of 70 credits.
- 11th and 12th grade students must take a minimum of 60 credits

This article missed the last newsletter of 2024 school year, so here is the JROTC info showcasing the great program activities from May and the summer:

As we approach the end of May, the Powder Battalion reflects back on a month of exceptional accomplishment, unwavering dedication, and a great sense of pride in our cadets. 

PHS FALL SPORTS 2025



1st Official day of Fall Sports is August 11th 1st Official day for Boys Golf is August 4th

You must complete the following steps at the start of each new season or sport to receive an orange card to try out and practice.

- 1- **Bring a paper copy** of your current physical to Cindy Smith in the Athletic Office. Please do not email or Fax. (A physical is good for 365 days and valid for all sports throughout the school year). The physical forms can be found on psdathletics.org
- 2- Complete online registration through Sports Engine. (Scroll to the bottom of the page and click on continue).
- 3- You can pay on School Pay (bring in a copy of your receipt) or you can pay at the school with our bookkeeper.
- 4- Cindy will check your classes and grades to make sure you are eligible for your season.

All 4 steps are required to receive an Orange Card. You will not be allowed to try out or participate if all 4 steps are not complete for each season.

<u>Orange</u> "Permit to Practice" cards will be issued for the fall season starting Tuesday July 29th. You must have an orange card to start tryouts on August 4th for Golf August 11th for the rest of the sports.

Athletic Participation Fees (no family maximum)

- PHS Students-\$220.00 per sport
- Unified Sports-\$110 per sport
- Charter/ Home or Private School Students-\$330.00 per sport pay as you go
- Charter/ Home or Private School Students- Unified Sports \$175.00 per sport pay as you ao
- PHS Students Ice Hockey- \$220 plus up to \$1,000
 - Charter/ Home or Private School Students-\$330.00 per sport plus up to \$1000.00
- PHS Students Nordic Ski- \$220 plus pay as you go
 - Charter/ Home or Private School Students-\$330.00 per sport plus pay as you go

If a student athlete is not offered a spot on a team, the athletic fee will be reimbursed in full.

Students who meet federal guidelines for the free or reduced lunch program will have the participation fee waived. You <u>must</u> register every year for the waived fee and then go to your parent view and fill out the "permission to share" form. Once these 2 steps are complete, it could take 10 days to go through the system. If you have been approved to have your fees waived, you still need to process your payment through school pay. (It will show up as \$0.00 due).

Eligibility

Eligibility will be checked at the beginning of each season. Fall eligibility is determined in August based on spring semester grades earned. Athletes identified as failing two or more classes during spring semester will be ineligible for fall sports until the regain date.

PHS checks athletic eligibility on a weekly basis. Athletes identified as failing two or more classes will be declared ineligible and will lose one week of eligibility, beginning on the following Monday through Saturday.

ALL athletes must be taking at least 25 credits in the current semester while participating in a sport and must have earned 25 credits the previous semester.


