

School Threats: What to Do if Your Child Witnesses One

In this day in age, we unfortunately hear and see a lot of disturbing things, whether it is in person, on TV, or on social media. What we can sometimes forget is that our children often see these things as well. We wanted to remind parents on best-practices surrounding what to do if you hear or see something that isn't right, but more specifically school threats.

In most cases where there was a school shooting, there was some sort of warning that the suspect would give. In years past, it usually came through a social media post. Kids tend to engage on social media apps that some adults may not, giving them a unique way to view information that adults may not have. Because of this, it is important to talk with your kids and make sure they know it is safe to talk to you and other adults about these topics.

When we speak in your students' classrooms, the message we give is "See something, say something". We teach them that they need to tell an adult, and the sooner the better, so we can respond faster. Each student should know how to access Safe2Tell, which is an anonymous tipline. These tips come directly to your student's School Administrative team, SRO, and our 911 Dispatch Center. Because there can be a lag in time to respond to Safe2Tell, we ask that if it is emergent and there is an imminent threat to the school, tell the SRO immediately or any adult in the school. If it is outside of school hours, please call 911.

We take all threats to our schools very seriously, whether it is a joke or real. If your child happens to witness this, please talk with them about reporting and gathering as much information as possible. Taking screenshots or videos of the information is very helpful to SRO's in identifying and contacting the person posting. Keep in mind that if you choose to report on Safe2Tell, we cannot reach out for more information unless you provide it within the tip, as it is anonymous. Providing as much information as possible is key in preventing these catastrophes from happening. School safety is the responsibility of all of us; it takes a team. Thank you for your time and cooperation with keeping our kids safe.

How Families Can Encourage their Student(s) to be *Principled* at Home:

- **Model honesty and integrity by following through on commitments, admitting mistakes, and showing your student that doing the right thing matters—even when it's difficult.**
- **Encourage accountability by having your student take responsibility for their actions, such as completing chores, owning up to mistakes, and making things right when needed.**
- **Talk through real-life choices by discussing everyday situations (schoolwork, friendships, online behavior) and asking, "What would be the right or fair choice here?"**
- **Recognize principled behavior by praising moments when your student demonstrates honesty, fairness, or respect, reinforcing that these actions are valued at home and school**

Please remind your student to wear their glasses or contacts to avoid rescreening at a later date.

As always, please keep your child at home if they are experiencing symptoms such as fever, chills, nausea/vomiting, diarrhea, or persistent (new) cough. 

Orange Card "Permit to Tryout & Participate" cards will be issued for the Spring season starting January 26th Monday through Friday 8:00am–4:00pm at the Athletics office.

You must have an orange card to start tryouts and practice.

To receive an **Orange Card**

1. Bring a paper copy of your current physical (if you don't already have a current one on file in the Athletic office) Make sure it is signed by a parent/guardian and athlete
2. Complete the online registration through Sports Engine at www.psdathletics.org
 - a. Hover over High School
 - b. Click on HS Online Registration
 - c. Click on the blue box: Register Poudre High School on the right-hand side
 - d. Scroll to the bottom of the page, click *sign in* or *create an account*
 - e. When you have completed the form, it will say "WOOHOO! YOUR'RE ALL SET"
3. Payment on www.schoolpay.com (there is a credit card fee) or pay the cashier at Poudre.
4. **Check in with Cindy Smith so she can check your grades and classes for Eligibility.**

ALL four steps are required to receive an Orange Card. You will not be allowed to tryout or participate if all four steps are not completed.

Spring Online Registration opens January 26th and closes March 13th.
Please do not wait until the last minute to complete the four steps above.

POUDRE HIGH SCHOOL SPRING SPORTS

Athletic Participation Fee

PHS Students

\$220.00 per sport, no family max

Charter/ Home or Private School Students

\$320.00 per sport, no family max

If a student athlete is not offered a spot on a team, the athletic fee will be reimbursed in full. Students who meet federal guidelines for the free or reduced lunch program will have the participation fee waived; you still have to complete the payment process online.

Eligibility

Eligibility will be checked at the beginning of each season. Eligibility is determined based on previous semester grades earned. Athletes identified as failing two or more classes during the previous semester will be ineligible for sports until the regain date. All sports have different regain dates.

PHS checks athletic eligibility on a weekly basis. Athletes identified as failing two or more classes will be declared ineligible and will lose one week of eligibility, beginning on the following Monday through Saturday.

COLLEGE FINANCIAL AID PROGRAMS

Parents of Seniors!



Have you heard of the Colorado Opportunity Fund and the CSS profile? They may help with the cost of college!

The Colorado Opportunity Fund, created by the Colorado Legislature, provides a stipend to eligible undergraduate students. The stipend pays a portion of the total in-state tuition when attending a participating college. Eligible undergraduate students must apply, be admitted and enroll in classes at a participating college to receive this benefit. Both new and continuing students are eligible for the stipend. Qualifying students may use the stipend for eligible undergraduate classes. The stipend is paid on a per credit hour basis directly to the college at which the student is enrolled. The credit-hour amount is set annually by the General Assembly.

The CSS Profile (College Scholarship Service Profile) is an online application by the College Board that collects detailed personal and family financial information from students applying for non-federal financial aid (grants, scholarships) at private colleges, universities, and scholarship programs, going deeper into assets, home equity, and business income than the FAFSA to help institutions determine eligibility for institutional aid. It's a crucial step for accessing institutional aid, often required alongside the FAFSA.
