It is important that seniors meet with their counselors to ensure that they have all their credits in line and that they have taken care of all those pieces that need to be in place for their college or career planning.



For 9th, 10th, and 11th graders, this is the time to begin considering which courses they want to take in the upcoming school year. Counselors are available for guidance. Curriculum guides for students and parents are posted to Poudre's course catalog. Poudre has a wealth of opportunities of which students can take advantage. Therefore, it's never too early to begin thinking about which classes are of interest and will support your student's chosen post-secondary path. On Thursday, January 15th, counselors will give registration presentations in students' classrooms, and students will have the opportunity to attend the Class Rush and learn more about the variety of classes offered at PHS. CAMPUS SELECT COLLEGE CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES (2026-2027)

Who Can Participate

- **Eligible students:** Current 11th and 12th graders
- **Prerequisite:** Completion of at least one High School Select course through FRCC or Aims with a **C or better**
- **Important Deadline:**
 - **Campus Select Application due by February 24, 2026**
(for the 2026–2027 school year)

What's Covered

- PSD pays **tuition, books, and fees** for up to **18 college credits** taken through Campus Select at **FRCC or Aims** (online or on campus).

Course Options

- **Guaranteed-Transfer General Education courses** (English, Math, Science, History, Government, Psychology, Communication, and more)
- **Career's Technical Education (CTE) Certificates**, including:
 - Veterinary Assistant (*12th grade only; pathway prerequisites required*)
 - Welding Fundamentals
 - Nurse Aide (*12th grade only; pathway prerequisites required*)
 - EMT (*12th grade only; pathway prerequisites required*)
 - Aims Aviation (Private Pilot Ground School C Aviation Meteorology)

Key Eligibility Reminders

- Students **cannot duplicate** a course already offered for college credit at their high school or the PSD Career Tech Center.
- Students must be enrolled in **at least 15 PSD credits in Quarter 1**, with **5 credits taken in person** at their high school.
- **Withdrawing or failing** a Campus Select course may result in **loss of future eligibility**.

Applications must be completed by **February 24, 2026**.

Eligibility:

- If a campus select course is offered **at your high school** or the **PSD Career Tech Center** for college credit (FRCC, Aims, or CU Succeed), you **cannot** take the same course online or at the FRCC/Aims campus.
- Students must complete the **Campus Select Application** by **February 24** for the following school year.
- Students must be enrolled in a minimum of **15 PSD credits during Quarter 1**, with a **minimum of 5 credits taken in person on the high school campus**. (3 college credits = 5 PSD credits)
- Students who **fail or withdraw** from a Campus Select course will **lose eligibility** for future Campus Select classes.

***Campus Select** - courses taken at FRCC or Aims either online or on the college campus

****High School Select** - college courses offered on your high school campus or at the PSD Career Tech Center. If students attend a school that does not offer any/many high school select courses, this requirement will be waived.



SRO CORNER

Rude vs. Mean vs. Bullying – What's the Difference?

As part of our commitment to creating a safe and respectful learning environment, we want to help families and students understand the difference between being **rude**, being **mean**, and **bullying**.

These words are sometimes used interchangeably, but they mean very different things—especially when it comes to how schools address them.



1. Rude

Definition:

Rude behavior is when someone says or does something hurtful—often without thinking—because they’re being inconsiderate, careless, or self-centered in the moment.

It’s usually not meant to hurt deeply or target a specific person repeatedly.

Examples:

- Interrupting someone while they are speaking.
- Making a joke that offends someone without realizing it.
- Cutting in line without saying “excuse me.”

What helps?

Gentle correction, modeling kindness, and practicing empathy usually turn these situations into learning moments.

2. Mean

Definition:

Being mean is when someone says or does something with the intention to hurt another person’s feelings, embarrass them, or put them down.

It’s often a reaction to anger, jealousy, or frustration—but still a choice.

Examples:

- Calling someone an unkind name.
- Making fun of someone’s appearance on purpose.
- Deliberately excluding a friend from a game.

What helps?

Mean behavior should be addressed directly. Apologies, repairing relationships, and teaching conflict resolution are key.

3. Bullying

Definition:

Bullying is *repeated, intentional harm*—physical, verbal, or social—where there is a power imbalance.

It’s not a one-time argument or an occasional unkind comment; it’s a pattern that can make someone feel unsafe at school.

Examples:

- Repeatedly spreading rumors to damage someone’s reputation.
- Consistently pushing, shoving, or intimidating someone.
- Targeting a younger or less confident student with ongoing insults.

What helps?

Bullying requires immediate adult intervention, clear consequences, and ongoing support for both the target and the student engaging in bullying behavior.

Why this matters

When students and families understand the difference between these behaviors, we can respond appropriately and teach skills that prevent problems from escalating.

One of our goals is to help students grow into respectful, compassionate, and responsible members of our school community.

If you or your child witnesses behavior that feels like bullying, please report it right away.

Together, we can ensure our school stays a safe place for everyone to learn and thrive.

COLLEGE APPLICATION HELP FROM COSI GRANT

Parents of Seniors!



This is the question many seniors are asking: Where do I find scholarships? The PSD scholarship application opened on **December 10**. This includes access to local scholarships and **Poudre High School specific** scholarships. The PSD scholarship application closes on **January 23 at 4:30**. <https://www.psdfutureready.org/scholarships/>

Additional scholarships can be researched through Xello. On the student's Xello home page, click on Plans, then Scholarships. Once students accept admission to their school, they will have access to more institutional scholarships.

Even if you don't think your family will qualify for Federal Student Aid, this form should still be completed. **Many scholarships and institutions require the completion of a FAFSA form.** Students create an account and start the form first. Then they will invite a parent to fill out the rest. The entire process should only take about 30 minutes. Grants, loans, and work study could be awarded through the FAFSA. <https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa>



This is the Western Undergraduate Exchange. Students may be able to attend a qualifying out-of-state school with in-state tuition. Every school has different approaches to the WUE.
