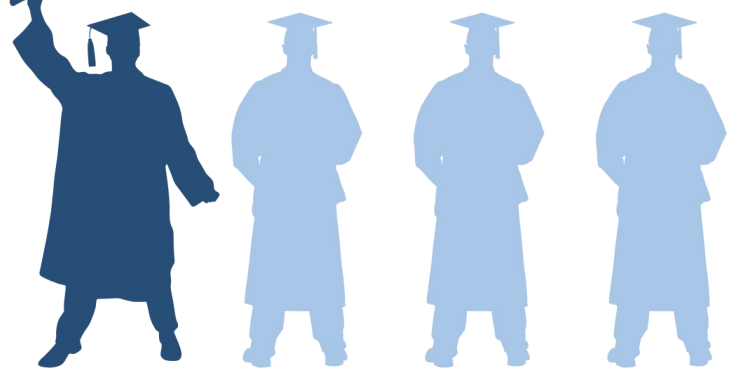
We encourage students to finish strong and enjoy the special moments that the end of the school year brings! Always proud to be a Poudre impala.

HEALTH OFFICE

Medication Pick Up: All student medications kept at school must be picked up by a parent no later than 11:00 AM on Wednesday May 27th. Any medications left at school after this time will be safely disposed of in line with Colorado state law. Please note that medications cannot be sent home with students. If medications are not needed during the school day and can be picked up before the last day of school, we encourage you to collect them earlier.

Immunizations: Please remember that starting November 1st of each school year, students who haven't received all the required vaccinations will be excluded from school according to Colorado state law. Summer is a great time to make sure your student is all caught up on their vaccinations. If you have concerns about vaccinations, you DO have the option to have a non-medical exemption. This can be done by completing a brief online module or by getting a signed form from a medical provider. It's important to note that this exemption needs to be completed each school year and must be dated July 1st, 2026, or later.

Recogida de medicamentos: Todos los medicamentos de los estudiantes que se guarden en la escuela deben ser recogidos por un padre o tutor a más tardar a las 11:00 a. m. del miércoles 27 de mayo. Cualquier medicamento que permanezca en la escuela después de esa hora será desechado de manera segura, de conformidad con las leyes del estado de Colorado. Tenga en cuenta que los medicamentos no pueden enviarse a casa con los estudiantes. Si los medicamentos no son necesarios durante la jornada escolar y pueden recogerse antes del último día de clases, le recomendamos que los retire con antelación.



Vacunaciones: Por favor, recuerde que, a partir del 1 de noviembre de cada año escolar, los estudiantes que no hayan recibido todas las vacunas requeridas serán excluidos de la escuela, según lo estipulado por las leyes del estado de Colorado. Students arriving after roll is taken may NOT be allowed to participate in the commencement ceremony! **It is SO important to arrive on time.**

2026 SENIOR CLASS BULLETIN

SEATING ASSIGNMENTS - The seating assignments for graduation practice and the graduation ceremony are the same. These assignments will be posted in the hallway across from the Counseling Office the week of graduation. You need to carefully check this posting for your name, side, row, seat location, and other important instructions. *Sorry, parents and students cannot request where a graduate is seated.*

CAP / GOWN / TASSEL - You are required to wear a cap, gown, & tassel at Commencement. They will be handed out beginning Monday, May 18th. You will need your **STAMPED checkout sheet** in order to get your cap and gown. Remember, you keep the cap, tassel, and the gown. **The Tassel** - The tassel is to be worn over the left temple. Tassels should never be pinned or sewed; they should be permitted to hang naturally.

The Gown - If you need to press the gown, do so with a **warm iron, not a hot one!**

DRESS FOR GRADUATION: There can be no alterations, additions, or changes to your cap, gown, or tassel. Any changes or additions must be removed or fixed prior to walking, so please leave them in their original form. All graduation gowns will be blue. Dress boots are appropriate if they are polished. No flowers, ornaments, or any other decorations are to be worn with caps & gowns. Faculty will check your manner of dress, your caps, and your gowns before you march. **This dress code is required!** There will be no place to change or leave any garments at CSU on Saturday.

PHOTOGRAPHS - There will be press and Graduation photographers on the floor during graduation. **We are not allowing any parents, friends, or relatives to photograph on the gym floor during commencement!** Because we have had difficulties with friends and relatives of graduates interrupting the flow of graduates going to and from the stage, as well as disconnecting wires of the sound systems, a professional photographer will take a picture of you receiving your diploma. A proof that you may keep for no charge, will be sent to you via email or mail. Flyers with contact information for the photographers will be handed out with the cap and gown.

ADA ACCESSIBLE SEATING - Handicapped seating is provided in the first two rows on the North and South sides of the gym. There will not be wheelchairs available to use at Moby Arena. A sign-language interpreter will be stationed in Section N on the South side of the gym.

COLLEGE APPLICATIONS - All students who have processed a college application must indicate, on the Senior Exit Survey, to which post-secondary institution they want their final transcript submitted.

VALEDICTORIANS and SALUTATORIAN – The final valedictorian and salutatorian recipients are determined at the end of fourth quarter. **The official valedictorian and salutatorian list may not be decided until May 19th.**

THE DEADLINE FOR ORDERING YOUR CAP AND GOWN HAS PASSED!!

METAL DETECTORS AT MOBY AREA: This year CSU is requiring metal detectors (magnetometers) at all entrances for rehearsal and the ceremony. The process will be very similar to airport screening. Attendees will be asked to remove cell phones, keys, cameras, and any other large metal objects from their pockets before walking through the metal detectors. If the device alarms, the guest will be re-screened with a hand-held wand, with further security follow-up if needed. Please refer to CSU's clear bag policy for additional information. Concealed weapons permits are not allowed.

CLEAR BAG POLICY

APPROVED BAGS

- Bags that are clear plastic, vinyl or PVC and do not exceed 12"W x 6"D x 12"H.
- One-gallon clear plastic freezer bag (Ziploc bag or similar).
- Small clutch bag approximately the size of a hand (4.5" x 6.5" or smaller), with or without a handle or strap. This can be carried separately or within a plastic bag.
- Seat cushions (soft and flexible, without frames or pockets).

All other bags are prohibited when entering the venue.

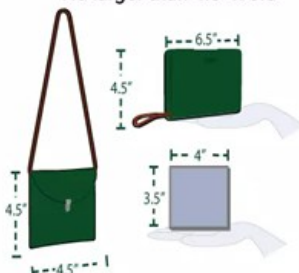

The following style and size bag, package, or container will be allowed in the gates at Colorado State Athletics events:

- Bags that are clear, plastic, vinyl, or PVC and do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12"
- One gallon clear plastic freezer bag (like a Ziploc)
- Small clutch bags, approximately the size of a hand, with or without handle or strap, may be taken into the venue (can't be larger than 4.5" x 6.5").
- An exception will be made for medically necessary supplies in a bag appropriate to the size of the medical supplies.

Logistics and Arrival

- Guest Arrival:
 - Doors open **one hour** before the ceremony.
 - Please use the upper concourse entrances.
 - Clear Bag Policy is in place. **[For more information about CSU's Clear Bag Policy please follow this link.](#)**
 - Absolutely no water bottles or food
 - Strollers and baby carriers will not be permitted into the facility.
 - Diaper bags will not be permitted into the facility.
 - Magnetometers:
 - CSU requires that all guests and employees pass through a metal detector.
 - Alternative accommodation for screening will be provided for those that need it.
 - All personal items, including cameras, must go through magnetometers.
- Parking:
 - Parking is free in the north and west lots around Moby. Carpooling is highly recommended due to limited spaces available at and near Moby Arena.
 - ADA Seating:
 - Accessible seating is available on a **first-come, first-served** basis.
 - ***One companion may sit with the guest.*** If more than one companion sits with the guest, they may be asked to relocate to accommodate others needing accessible seating.
 - Moby Arena does **not provide wheelchairs**; please plan accordingly.
- Interpretation:
 - PSD will have AI-generated interpretation/translation for many languages available through a QR code. Please bring your cell phone and earbuds to access.
 - An interpreter will be available for Spanish-speaking families in Section M.
 - Contact your school as soon as possible to request interpretation services in any language other than Spanish.
 - Guests who need American Sign Language (ASL) interpretation services may sit in Section N.



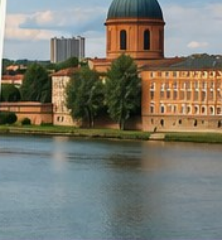
