

Attention Current 9th grade students & families

High school credit earned in middle school

When a student transitions from middle school to high school, students who completed qualifying high school credit earning courses while in middle school, will see these courses and grades included on their high school course history in Student VUE/Parent VUE. These credits and grades are included in a student's high school transcript and grade point average.

Students/Parents may choose to NOT receive HS credit for qualifying middle school courses. Please review and consult with the student's high school counselor as needed. The window for declining HS credit begins the FIRST DAY of a student's ninth grade school year and ends the LAST DAY of a student's ninth grade school year. Counselors can work with you to complete the PSD High School Credit for Middle School Courses Opt-out Form

PSD Seal of Biliteracy

<u>What</u>: The Seal of Biliteracy is an endorsement given by Poudre School District in recognition of students who have studied and attained proficiency in reading, speaking, listening, and writing at a high level in English AND any another world language. The Seal appears on the diploma of the graduating senior and is a statement of accomplishment for future employers and for college admissions.

How: You can show proficiency in each language based on various standardized tests and/or proficiency tests.

For more specific information about qualifying scores or tests, talk to your counselor.

<u>Who</u>: Current seniors who can demonstrate proficiency in English and in a world language are eligible for the seal regardless of their native language. If you think you may be eligible and need more information, talk to your counselor.

• You may receive a letter before winter break that automatically qualifies you for the Seal of Biliteracy.

When:

- You MUST fill out a quick google form by January 31, 2023 to be considered (<u>https://sites.google.com/psdschools.org/psdsealofbiliteracy/application?authuser=1</u>)
- You will receive a letter about your status (the letter will explain a proficiency test given at Poudre that you will need to take in the Spring)

<u>Why</u>: You will receive a cord at graduation, and the Seal of Biliteracy will be listed on your diploma and on your official transcript. It will also be a great marketing asset on college applications, scholarships, resume and employment.

Why should I take Yearbook? RECORD THE YEAR

Each week, staff will be asked to cover an activity, event, or person to feature in the book. Students will attend social and academic events, for free, and record the experiences of the students. Afterwards, they will process their pictures and turn their notes into captions and stories for the book.

Students work together to create the theme look, colors, and design of the book. They use graphic design, photojournalism, and computer skills to turn their pictures and stories into dynamic and exciting pages in the book.

Students learn to take action shots, use angles and lighting, and capture the events of the year as they happen. Every week is a new opportunity to get great shots and interesting coverage. Students can even win awards and scholarships for yearbook photography.

Staff works in a fast-paced, energetic environment, working in key college and job skills, like management, writing, design, and marketing, while learning collaboration, responsibility, finance, and creativity.

How does Yearbook work?

Yearbook is a unique class where the results of your hard work is seen by thousands of people. At the end of the year, your homework becomes a souvenir of all the great events, personal profiles, and amazing stories of the PHS year. We work hard to document the whole story of the year, and everyone in the school. We take pictures, interview people, write stories, and get quotes. In addition, we learn design, publishing, marketing, and advanced photography skills. Yearbook definitely focusses on 21st century skills, like collaboration, creativity, working to deadlines, running a business, graphic art and design, and time management. That's why Yearbook looks really good on a college transcript and resume! The work involved in Yearbook often seems overwhelming to people, but we have streamlined the process so that most people only have one or two assignments a week. What if I don't drive?


